

Mr. Eisenlohr was one of the close friends of the late George E. Kessler, noted city planner, who drew up the Dallas city plan. He knew Mr. Kessler when the latter was just a boy, a carpet salesman in Sanger Bros.' store. When he grew older, his mother sent him to Europe to study landscape gardening and Mr. Eisenlohr met him there in 1880. After Mr. Kessler returned from Europe one of his first periods of employment was with a railroad company, Mr. Eisenlohr recalled. The railroad company paid the man that later became one of the most famous landscape engineers and city planners of the country, a salary of \$75 a month and lodging.

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
