

Walter Armstrong Stevens (1874-1932)

Walter Stevens became interested in literature and newspapers when he was a student in Dallas High School. After he finished the Southwestern University in Georgetown, he became a publisher. As a consultant to his sister, Annie, he participated in the donation to the City of Dallas of 40 acres of the family farm that became the nucleus of the Stevens Park Golf Course. At the time of his sudden death he was Vice President of the Stevens Park Estates development company, actively involved in sales and financing of lots in the new subdivision.
