Alex Sanger Grieved.

Alex Sanger, head of Sanger Bros., expressed himself as deeply grieved by Mr. Kessler's death. He said: "In the '80s George Kessler, then a boy, worked for us as a stock and cash boy. Even then he showed a measure of the ability and frankness of character, which later brought him such notable success. He was a rather frail boy, and his mother, Mrs. Clothilde Kessler, prudently desired to have him find employment which would keep him more in the open. She concluded to take him to Europe for education as a landscape architect, in which direction his talents even then appeared to lay. I have kept in close touch with him in the years since and have been very proud of his success. In his death I have lost a very dear personal friend.

"His mother was a most charming and cultivated woman. While in Dallas she taught German and artwork. She loved the boy, George, as only a mother can, and his career justified her faith in him."
